	It was noted that there are radios in use that are not ALMR compatible. They need to be identified.		
	To that end, Tim Woodall shared that the DoD has let a contract to the Space and Naval Warfare Systems (SPAWAR) Center San Diego. SPAWAR is the U.S. Navy's research, development, test and evaluation, engineering and fleet support center for command, control and communication systems and ocean surveillance. SPAWAR is contracted to develop a Concept of Operations (CONOPS) and a Tactical Interoperable Communications Planning Guidance and Template (TCIP) for each trooper detachment area based on the 15 all-hazard scenarios. They will permit a scenario swap to meet individual needs of an area. The TCIP will explain factors that inhibit and/or facilitate interoperability. It will also outline the tactics, techniques and procedures to ensure interoperability. This information will be sensitive and therefore classified at the appropriate security rating.		
	The CONOPS will address the Incident Command process at the local, state, and federal levels. It will describe how to transition between the levels of government.
