	Paul briefed that the two Issues and Risks Logs items are the vacant council members. He noted that Mary has sent out emails to the areas that need representation. Paul stated that these have	

	been on here for quite a while and the OMO is still trying to find individuals, so he kindly asked if everybody could reach out in those areas to try and find a replacement. He commented that obviously the main individuals are here quite a bit, but the council does need those areas filled. Paul noted that was all he had. Scott N. thanked Paul and stated that the council could move on to the Action Items.

	Paul briefed that there are two items are on there and the teams have still been doing a lot of testing for the APX Next radios, and they are still working on the software. He noted that Mr. Fahnestock and his team have been working with the Alaska Public Safety Communications Service (APSCS) engineers with the radios and are making a lot of progress with them. Paul stated that, however, once in a while they see a couple of bugs in them, so once the teams are done with them, and he apologizes to everyone and just asks for their patience with the testing, there are a lot of new products on there, and a lot of new features that they want to go through. Paul noted that was all he had. Scott N. asked if there were any questions from the council regarding that, hearing none, he then moved on to the Operation Management Office (OMO) updates.

Training	1. Paul briefed that Mr. Dan Nelson has not put out a training video for this month. He noted that they have a couple more ideas for the videos, but if anybody out there has an idea that they would like a training video made on, to please let him know and then he and Dan can work on creating it. Paul stated that the latest video Dan did was the preventative maintenance inspection (PMI) video.	
Outreach	2. Paul briefed that the OMO team is working on the membership agreements and cost share and

are ahead of where they were last year for compliance. He noted that there are just eight membership agreements left out of 140, so he appreciates everybody who has been signing the membership agreements and returning them.

Paul noted that he has been calling individuals and agencies to see if there are any issues or concerns.

Paul stated that the federal grants have just come out a little bit ago, so he encourages everybody to reach out to the Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM) and talk to them about federal grants because there are some that are for radios. He commented that he has also reached out to a couple of different organizations for grants and when he does find some that might fit he will let those organizations know.

Paul briefed that he thinks everybody knows by now that on July 17th Motorola conducted a software upgrade for the Fairbanks Alaska State Troopers (AST) dispatch center. He noted that the update was due to the center moving from the MCC 7500 dispatch consoles to the newer AXS models. Paul stated that Motorola had issues with the software and this took down all dispatch centers on ALMR across the state for approximately seven hours. He commented that he did set up a meeting with all the dispatch centers and affected parties on Thursday, August 7th to talk about what happened and to go over Motorola's new after action report and individual Primary, Alternate, Contingency, and Emergency (PACE) plan. Paul wanted to thank everyone who attended the meeting, and he sent out a follow-up email asking the dispatch centers what worked, what did not work, and any issues they might have had, which he only received three replies back. He is compiling them to sit down and talk with Mr. Scott Stormo, Nik and his team, and Motorola. He commented that the individuals/agencies who did receive the email from him to please take the time to fill that out. He has been contacted by some folks that said they are working on the emails, which he appreciates, because the group needs to learn from this and make sure that this does not happen again.

Paul noted that another aspect that is coming up from 18 August to 5 September is that there will be a Department of Defense (DoD) cybersecurity team monitoring ALMR, this does not have to do with anything that is happening on Friday, August 15. He stated that this was set up a long time ago, and he asked Mr. David Reed, the security manager, if he wanted to comment on this item.

David stated that he did not have any comments, but if there are any questions, feel free to ask or email him directly.

Paul stated that the quarterly security updates are going to be conducted on the 26th to 28th of August, which is when he, Nik, and his team come in, contact all the dispatch centers, and then perform the zone control rollovers. He commented that to keep this in mind and that Ms. Claire Wittschiebe already has it on the daily report as a reminder that on those dates, ALMR will be doing security updates.

Paul briefed that on 21 July he, Nik, and some engineers from APSCS were asked to go out to Bryant Field and work with the Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, Department of Public Safety (DPS), and also search and rescue (SAR) team to find a common frequency. He noted that they were able to put the State 1 interoperability channel on all of their helicopters and their ground radios, and they ran com checks on that channel, so it worked out really well.

Paul stated he also met with the counterdrugs Commander for the Army National Guard on 12 August and let her know what the common frequency was. He commented that the Major is going to be reaching back out to him and the APSCS engineers to work on that for her radios.

Mr. Timothy (Tim) Woodall inquired if Paul was talking about the channel or was he talking about a talkgroup or frequency.

Paul responded that is the channel under the conventional frequency.

Tim asked if that is under the state operational (OP) Zone.

Paul answered in the affirmative and stated that it is called State 1, but it used to be LE Tac.

Tim confirmed LE Tac.

Paul noted that the new name, when they changed everything, is now State 1. He stated that the frequency stayed the same and the name changed, which was a confusion where some people had State 1 on their radios and some had LE Tac.

Tim stated that since that is a state network primarily for troopers, he asked if the DoD needs to add a VHF frequency to one of their base defense zones or are they just using one VHF channel.

Paul stated that they are using just one VHF channel.

Tim commented that he will look into assigning a VHF number, so the DoD military operations does not interfere with SAR groups unless it is for when interoperability is needed. He noted that the DoD has ways of doing that with SAR groups, so if this is just for military use he said let him work on getting a VHS number.

Paul noted that it was for interoperability.

Tim asked if this was just between military or was it also civilian.

Paul commented that it was for everyone. He also noted that for everyone on Teams and the phone, he and Tim are talking about the operation that took place, and they had the Air National Guard, Coast Guard, the DPS helicopter, and SAR teams, for example the Army, Alaska Mountain Rescue, and Mat-Sar. Paul stated that when doing interoperability for SAR coordination, they had to find a common frequency, for everyone to use. They went through and made sure everybody had State 1 or the old LE Tac. and the State 1 license holder is Mr. Scott Stormo and his team. He commented that the group did not know they could talk to each other on that channel. Paul noted that Lt. Ben Endres was there and Helo 3, the trooper helicopter was there, also, and the pilots.

Tim noted that he is sure they will write that in the plans.

Paul noted that Colonel Edwards was annotating that for her checklist.

Tim stated that if they appear to abuse it to just let him know.

Paul commented that he does not think they will. He noted that the problem in the past with the SAR staff was trying to find a common frequency that the ground SAR teams could talk to the military helicopter if they got dropped off and on a mountain.

Mary stated to the chair that another member had joined and that there was now a quorum.

Scott N. thanked the member that joined and stated that the council now has a quorum. He asked if the group wanted to proceed with the OMO update or does the group go back and review the minutes.

Paul stated that he would like to finish his report, then go back to the minutes if that is acceptable to the chair.

Scott N. answered in the affirmative.

System Upgrade

3. Paul stated that he briefed at the Executive Council meeting last week that the transportable units, TAS and TAN, upgrade is still being worked on and has not been completed. He noted that it was supposed to start in June, however it has not started. Paul briefed that Tim has been very proactive with that, and Paul wanted to thank him for his time on the TAS/TAN upgrade.

July Document Reviews

4. Paul briefed that the July document reviews were completed, and they consisted of the High Level Communication Strategy; the OMO Customer Support Plan; the Interoperability policy and procedure; the Key Management Facility (KMF) policy and procedure; and the User Council Charter.

Paul asked if there were any questions before he went to the metrics, hearing none, he continue to

the metrics. He noted he thought he saw a hand go up.

Mr. Rob Ragadio stated that he had a question about the exercise and regarding the LE Tac/State 1 channel. He inquired if there was an after action request for Motorola or is everybody clear as to how they know what they need to do when it comes to any SAR type of situation.

Paul answered in the negative.

Tim noted that with regard to the TAS and TAN, Mr. Dinkens, the project manager, informed Tim that all the equipment has been received. He stated he is working with Arcticom to do the install, and he hopes since the DoD is going to lose their funding at the end of September if it does not get used that Arcticom will have the install done in the next couple of weeks. Tim commented that he guesses right now it is up to Arcticom and when they have the ability to get out there and do it, but he would imagine they are close.

Paul asked if anybody had anything else before he goes on to the metrics.

Scott N. asked Mary if there were any online and she replied in the negative.

July System Metrics

5. Paul briefed that the group and individual calls for July were 1,729,360; the push-to-talks were 2,820,681; the monthly busies, which were down from last month, were 1230; and the monthly sites below three nines have gone up the last couple of months and they are now at 23.

Paul noted, however, that if members look at the reasons why, they will see the ALIVE antennas, the teams have been going out and replacing the ALIVE antennas, because there were issues with them the last time, so they are putting all new antennas in there. Nik's team has been going out and doing a lot of PMIs, so they have crews out there now also. Paul stated that the system did have a couple of commercial circuit issues that were beyond ALMR control, but that is why the numbers have gone up as there has been a lot of work out in the field. There is a lot of good weather, so the teams want to make sure that

they are covering everything before the areas start getting snow up on those mountain sites.

Paul stated that if the members look at the subscriber counts by zones, Zone 1, 2, and 4, it is broken down to the numbers there and this is the totality. He commented that ALMR did have approximately 400 more radios added from last month, but ALMR is still below 33,000. Paul noted that he knows that Nik and his team received some more subscriber requests to remove radios, so as they go through, he thanked everybody for being proactive, but the numbers have been staying the same. Paul stated, that ALMR is adding some, but they are also taking quite a few off of there, so thanks everybody with your subscriber requests.

Paul asked if there were any questions from the group on the metrics and stated that he is almost done.

Other Items

6. Paul briefed that he is working on traveling to the Zone 2 master site sometime next month to conduct his inspection there with the backups and the maintenance of the system.

Paul noted that he was in Baltimore 27 July to 2 August, that is part of the OMO contract, and that was to attend the Motorola Trunked Users Group (MTUG); the Genesis User Forum; the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) conferences, which there was a lot of good information and he has downloaded all the training slides and has them on file. He stated that there were good meetings and that there were a couple of other folks from Alaska, and they got together and visited a little bit and hashed over some notes. Paul commented that it was a really good session.

Paul stated that currently Operation Arctic Edge is being held on Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson (JBER), August 12th and today, August 13th, and that focus was on interoperability to prevent human trafficking and the impact on local communities. He commented that he did attend yesterday, August 13th, morning and he was there for a couple of hours before the ice dam broke in Juneau, and he had to leave to come back to the ALMR office.

Paul briefed that the FY27 OMO/SMO Operational Budget was discussed at last week's Executive Council meeting and that the OMO office is just waiting for the final voting on that and then it will be sent over to APSCS. He noted that the OMO wanted to say thank you to the User Council members who were proactive on their questions and their voting for the budget.

Paul noted that, ALMR is monitoring the flooding in Juneau and he has been sitting through State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) briefings. He stated that he and Nik have been watching the towers there and they did not have any busies that they can see. Paul commented that there has been quite a bit of radio traffic, but that water has impacted homes, which is disastrous and affects people. He noted that it has not affected or come near any of the ALMR towers, so the radio traffic and communications have not stopped there.

Paul stated that he had just three parting things: the Alaska State Fair in Palmer starts on August 15th; kids are back to school this week so be careful driving around; and August 2025 is the inaugural National Emergency Management Awareness Month, which is ironic since there are issues out west and Juneau, but this is the first Emergency Management Awareness month.

Paul commented that is all he has for his briefings, pending any questions.

Scott N. thanked Paul and asked if there were any questions from the group.

Mr. Rikk Rambo stated that he had one quick question as far as with Putin and Trump oncoming this right thing, nobody got notified about that yet or as far as anyone to understand.

Paul stated that for the group that was Mr. Rambo, who is the Alaska Law Enforcement Coordinator with Western States Information Network (WISN), is asking the question. Paul responded that he has not been tasked with anything and neither has Nik, so ALMR has not been tasked with anything. He noted that if he hears anything in that regard he will let the appropriate people know in the next couple of days.

	Rikk thanked Paul. Scott N. noted that for general knowledge the State Emergency Operations Center will relocate to its alternate site at Alcantra on Friday, just to stay out of the way Scott N. thanked Paul and stated that he would press on with the meeting minutes.

He noted that they try to keep the downtime to a minimum and to have the least amount of interruption to everyone out there. Nik stated that he honestly does not have a lot this time, but he did have a thought where the group hears a lot of thank yous, congratulations, typically going one way from dispatchers to	

	whether it be his office, Paul, or whoever, but something he does not really hear much of is a thank you or congratulations to the dispatcher, so he said thank you for what they do. He commented that he gets to hear bits and pieces of their day-to-day operations and honestly that is a nightmare compared to what he has to do, so thank you. Nik stated that was all he had. 	Mr. Scott Stormo briefed that one really good piece of news is that the \$24 million project is, as far as the state's portion of it, is considered done and they are just waiting for the final invoice from Motorola. He noted that the state will finally have that 4 plus year project behind them and waiting for the next one to start. Scott S. stated that there are a few things left on the DoD side, primarily Juniper routers, and DoD is working on the Ethernet circuits to be able to support those so once those are done, the DoD side of that project will be completed as well.	
	Scott S. noted that other than that, the state team returned to Cordova yesterday, August 12 th , afternoon because the weather was looking decent. He stated that everyone has probably seen the notices, but they are trying to pull the ALMR equipment out of the old shelter, tuck it in the generator shelter, and keep the site operational while the old shelter then can be cut up and removed by a contractor. Scott S. commented that they have a new shelter sitting down there that they will get slung up and put together, and a new tower that one of the partners is actually paying to have built will get put together up there. He noted that then ALMR will move back into a brand new shelter, which is good news because that shelter for about 20 years has been on a deferred maintenance. A waterlogged, leaky roof was on the to be replaced lists, so it is good to finally have the light at the end of the tunnel to get this one done.	

	Scott S. stated that was all he had pending any questions. Paul asked Scott S. if he could give the council a brief on the power project for the building. Scott S. briefed that it was completed, luckily, with another one that has gone for quite a long time, because every time, they were getting ready to do something, something else popped up with more priority. He noted that the original transformer that was put in with the building, when Chugach was looking at what APSCS was doing, basically, said that had to go, so the building has a brand new transformer. Scott S. stated that it provides power to the building and some power out to our yard, which never had power to it and that was what this project started with, so that whole process went through. He commented that state put new batteries in the master site just to make sure those were in good shape in case the building is out of electricity for a while. Scott S. noted that while they worked on this the outage time for commercial power was minimized and Chugach Electric worked closely with the state to make sure they did as much as work as possible without removing power to the building, except for when they had to and then the state ran on backup power. He stated that it was successful and without any outages caused, which he was glad to see. Scott N. stated he would move on to the DoD and asked if Tim had anything to share.

	Scott N. asked if there were any new items.	
CISA	Mr. Bruce Richter, from Cybersecurity Infrastructure and Security Agency (CISA), stated he wanted to thank Paul for sharing the Public Safety Threat Alliance information, which was kind of a summary of attacks against public safety communications over the first six months of the year, and it came in an email Tuesday, August 12th or maybe Monday, August 11th, this week. He noted that it is worth everyone's time just to skim through the document, it is a fast, easy read, and it is good to take advantage of lessons learned from people that have been victims, so you don't have to be one. Bruce stated that since that document came out last week, St. Paul, Minnesota Police Department got hit by the Interlock ransomware gang in late July. He commented that there is a joint FBI, CISA, and Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC) bulletin giving people some of the indicators of compromises and how they can better prevent from being a victim of that. Bruce noted that just this week, a public safety agency back in New Jersey got hit by QJIN ransomware gang that took them out of service and then Bruce just noticed today, August 13th, when looking at the website of the ransomware people claiming their success, they have targeted the regional native corporation that is based out of Glennallen, Ahtna, Inc. He stated that here it goes. Midwest, East Coast, Alaska, and the	
	threat is not going away, so stay aware of what's going on out there. Scott N. said thank you to Bruce and commented that he guesses that means that nobody is too small to get hit. He stated that the council will move on to any other new business or are there any questions or comments regarding Bruce's briefing.	
	Rikk noted that he just has one item for the group, which is he just had a meeting with Brett	

	Johnson from Government FirstNet yesterday, August 12th on site and they have some new things to add as far as networking for emergency situations, so like say an agency has something out in the middle of nowhere, there would be immediate networking for 100-200 phones. He stated they have a couple of new items besides the case they had before, which they did have a very large situation in the lower 48 and for us up here, they had networking abilities out of like large case to network up to 200 phones. Rikk commented if anybody is interested in that, feel free to give him a ring, Mary has his contact information for anybody that is online right now. And if anyone has questions about that, Government FirstNet has anything they can offer for emergency situations to network, just get a hold of him and he can give them the information.
